HUNDREDS CHART ACTIVITIES

Here are some activities to help your child build understanding of the numbers 1-100

- Count forward and backward pointing to each number.
 - Don't always start from 1.
- Count up and down in tens pointing to each ...

“10, 20, 30 ...” or “100, 90, 80 ...”
- Drop a counter or paperclip on the chart.
 - Read the number it landed on.
 - What is the number before it?
 - What is the number after it?
- Drop a counter on the chart.

Throw a dice ... count that number on or back

e.g. The counter landed on **28** and a **3** was thrown on the dice.
Count on “29, 30, 31” or count back “27, 26, 25”.
- Hide a number ... can your child think what the number is without removing the cover?
- Pick up a number ... Read the number ...
 - Who can find it first on the chart?
 - What is the number before it?
 - What is the number after it?
- Cut up the chart to make a puzzle ... can your child put it back together?
